

# Summer Work Program

Through Nunatsiavut Government's Aboriginal Skills & Employment Training Strategy (ASETS), Inuit Pathways offers financial assistance to Organizations/employers to hire students for summer work opportunities. The program is designed to provide meaningful summer work experience to students. This summer work will assist students to develop career focus, as well as, enhance employability skills.

## Eligibility Criteria

- Summer students must be a beneficiary of the Labrador Inuit Land Claims Agreement
- Summer students must be at least 15 but under 30 years of age at beginning of summer work project
- Students participating in summer work activities must have been previously enrolled in secondary or post-secondary education and be returning to school upon completion of summer work project.

# Job Start Support Program

Through Nunatsiavut Government's Aboriginal Skills & Employment Training Strategy (ASETS), the Job Start Supports program provides assistance to beneficiaries to allow them to accept an offer of employment.

Assistance can be provided to cover costs associated with the following:

Tools/equipment

Work clothing

## Eligibility Criteria

- Applicant must be a beneficiary of the Labrador Inuit Land Claims Agreement
- Applicant must have completed pre-employment training and is a first year apprentice
- Applicant must be currently unemployed and provide proof of offer of full-time employment
- Applicant must complete a Job Start Support Program Application and provide a list of tools required with estimated costs.
