The Hopedale Inuit Community Government Recreational Vehicles (Snowmobile and Motor Vehicle) Regulations 2011

1. Interpretations: In these regulations unless the context otherwise require:
 - (a) "Act" means the Municipalities Act and any amendments to it
 - (b) "Council" means the Hopedale Inuit Community Government Council of the Town of Hopedale as determined under the Municipalities Act
 - (c) "Town" means the Town of Hopedale as defined by order in Council dated the 12th day of May, 1969 or any amendments thereto, and/or continued under Chapter M-23, 1990, and contained under the Municipalities Act
 - (d) "Snowmobile" means a motorized vehicle designated and constructed for travel over snow and ice
 - (e) "Sled" means any snow sled, komatik or snow toy designed and made for a child
 - (f) "Motor Vehicle" means all terrain vehicles, motor cycles and automobiles which includes cars and trucks
 - (g) "Skis" means any cross country or downhill skis
 - (h) "Owner" means
 - (i) The person who holds the legal title to the vehicle, except in the case of a mortgaged vehicle, then the mortgagor if he is entitled to possession of the vehicle
 - (ii) In the case of a registered vehicle, the person in whose name it is so registered
 - (iii) In the case of a vehicle which is subject to a rental agreement or purchase agreement, the person in possession of the vehicle under the agreement
 - (iv) In the case of a vehicle which is subject to a conditional sales contract, the buyer or purchaser under the contract except in the case where the holder of the conditional sales contract is entitled to possession of the vehicle.

2. No snowmobile or motor vehicle shall be operated in the community unless its lights are on and working properly.
3. Any snowmobile or motor vehicle operated in the community must be equipped with a muffler on its engine that operates properly.
4. Any snowmobile or motor vehicle operated in the community must be equipped with an adequate braking system that is in working order.
5. (a) There shall be no towing of any person or persons at any time by snowmobiles or motor vehicles within the community unless the person or persons being towed are in or on a suitable sled, komatik, or trailer which is attached to the towing vehicle by way of a fixed tow bar.
(b) The riding of passengers on the front of motor bikes, motor cycles, cars, trucks, all terrain vehicles and snowmobiles shall not be permitted.
6. No person(s) shall be towed on a sled or skis by a snowmobile or motor vehicle within the community.
7. (a) No person under the age of thirteen (13) years shall operate a snowmobile within the community
(b) No person under the age of sixteen (16) years shall operate an all terrain vehicle or other vehicle that does not require a provincial driver's license within the community.
8. (a) The owner of any snowmobile shall not knowingly permit any person under the age of thirteen (13) years to operate his/her vehicle.
(b) The owner of any motor vehicle shall not knowingly permit any person under the age of sixteen (16) years to operate his/her vehicle.
(c) The owner of the snowmobile who permits anyone under the age of thirteen (13) years to operate his/her vehicle is in contravention of these regulations and can be charged.
(d) The owner of the motor vehicle who permits anyone under the age of sixteen (16) years to operate his/her vehicle is in contravention of these regulations and can be charged.
(e) No person shall be permitted to operate mini-snowmobiles, mini ATV's, and or pocket bikes on a public road.
9. Violations of this regulation are subject to the general penalty as per section 448 of the Municipalities Act which reads:
 - A person who (a) contravenes or fails to comply with this Act or regulation or order made under this Act; or
 - (b) tears down, removes or damages a regulation, order or notice posted by Councilis guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction, where a penalty is not otherwise provided, to a fine not less than \$50.00 and not exceeding \$1,000.00 or in default of payment to a period of imprisonment not exceeding 90 days, or to both a fine and a period of imprisonment.

10. These regulations were adopted and passed by Council by resolution # 11-154 on the 5th day of October, 2011, and replaces all previous "Town Council of Hopedale Recreational Vehicle (Snowmobile and Motor Vehicle) regulations."

11. These regulations may be cited as the "Hopedale Inuit Community Government Recreational Vehicle (Snowmobile and Motor Vehicle) Regulations 2011" and shall become effective on the 5th day of October, 2011.

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
