NUNATSIAVUT ASSEMBLY

AN ACT TO AMEND THE FINANCIAL ADMINISTRATION ACT, CIL F-1, 31-12-2012

Be it enacted by the President of Nunatsiavut and the Nunatsiavut Assembly as follows:

SHORT TITLE

1. This Inuit Law may be cited as the Financial Administration Amendment Act, 2017.

TRANSITIONAL ARRANGEMENTS DELETED

2. Section 29 of the *Financial Administration Act* is deleted in its entirety.

PRESIDENT REPLACES FIRST MINISTER ON COMMITTEE

3. Section 30 of the *Financial Administration Act* is re-numbered as section 29 and the words "First Minister" are deleted and replaced with "President".

COMMITTEE MEMBERS MAY DELEGATE FUNCTIONS

4. A new section 30 is added to the *Financial Administration Act* as follows:

Committee Members May Delegate Functions

30.

- (1) The President, the Treasurer and the Controller may, in written instruments provided to the Communities Joint Management Committee, delegate their respective functions as members of the committee to officials of the Nunatsiavut Government who are responsible to them.
- (2) If an AngajukKâk cannot attend a meeting of the Joint Management Committee for medical reasons, death in the family or as a consequence of a court order, the AngajukKâk may, in a written instrument provided to the Inuit Communities Joint Management Committee, appoint the Inuit Community's Deputy

- AngajukKâk or a member of the Inuit Community Council to act as the Inuit Community's representative at the meeting with full power to vote.
- (3) A member of the Inuit Communities Joint Management Committee who makes a delegation under subsection (1) or an appointment under subsection (2) may, from time to time in a written instrument provided to the Committee, revoke or revoke and replace the delegation or appointment.

EFFECTIVE DATE

5. This Act comes into effect when it is registered in accordance with the *Nunatsiavut Laws Registration Act*.
