We are looking for Inuit with strong Inuttitut language skills who are eager to contribute to language revitalization efforts. Experience teaching children or adults is an asset but not required.

Who We're Looking For Individuals who:

- Are fluent or highly proficient in Inuttitut (there is room to grow!)
- Are passionate about strengthening the language
- Enjoy working with people and sharing knowledge
- Are interested in developing language materials and teaching tools
- Have experience teaching or mentoring (an asset, but not required)

What's involved?

- Travel to Iqaluit for two-three weeks at a time multiple times this year to work alongside other Inuit language experts at the Pirurvik Centre to develop language resources for Inuttitut:.
- Participate in training to enhance teaching and language skills in class and land-based settings;
- Support community-based language learning program;
- Contribute to the creation of learning materials tailoured to Inuttitut; and
- Help revitalize and strengthen Inuttitut for future generations
